Private G. A. Adams enlisted at the age of 36 at Halifax about the first of November, 1917, in the Nova Scotia Forestry Battalion (No. 12) and sailed for England less than a month later. Various sections of his unit performed invaluable services in England, Scotland and in France providing the necessary timber which was required in tremendous quantities all along the line of operations. Being detained in England on special duty, Private Adams was only able to cross over to France a short time before the armistice was signed.
