*HUMULUS LUPULUS.*

Some of the best plants are ignored because so common, and this may be said of the common Hop vine, which is a hardy perennial climber, of very easy culture. It is very vigorous and free growing, and aside from the use of the heads in brewing, the vine may well be employed as an ornamental climber. *LONICERA HALLEANA.*

We must not on any account forget to mention Hall's Honeysuckle, for this appears to be one of the hardiest and easiest to cultivate of this universally admired genus. The vine is strong and vigorous, and almost evergreen. The flowers are very fragrant, but not very conspicuous. It continues in bloom from June to November.
