(Matt. xxviii. 18-20, R. V.) The phrase "Discutte of Christ," sub-head to this paper, is intended to make clear the meaning of the name "EVANGELIST," which signifies a publisher of good news or glad tidings. This paper holds to the New Testament as containing an accurate record of the life and teaching of Jesus Christ and of His Apostles.
