

 reads about in the papers, he's No. 1."

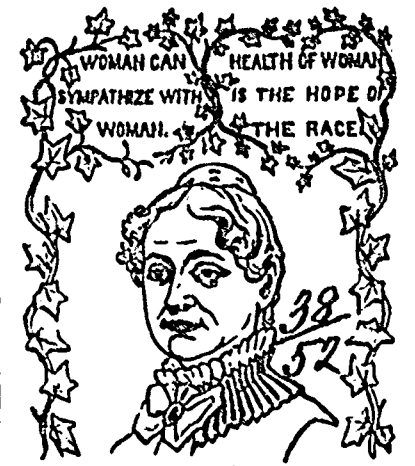
TITZY were walking along by the green
