The chapters on inflammation of the bulbous and prostatic urethra and also those dealing with the prostate and seminal vesicles are specially to be commended and invite our most serious consideration. New chapters on vaginismus and masturbation in women are added. The treatment of these various disorders follow along the lines deduced from a consideration of pathological conditions found, rather than from any preconceived notions. Some chapters are necessarily short in a work of this kind as chap XXVII on sexual perversion, but, as the author explains, these have been exploited *ad nauseam*. One cannot read this work without greatly benefitting by the many suggestions which invite one into new paths of thought.
