CANADIAN INTERVENTION ON HUMAN SETTLEMENTS

STATEMENT BY JOHN BELL HEAD OF DELEGATION

Mr. Chairman, on behalf of the Canadian delegation, I'd like to commend the Secretariat first for recognizing the significant contribution in human settlements to the concept of sustainable development and second, for including human settlements as a separate agenda item for this meeting.
