MCDUGALL: No I don't think so. I think that we recognize that like the Free Trade Agreement, this is going to be a tough negotiating process. We have some things that...our cultural industries for example that are simply not on the table, period, full stop, not there. And we went through this the last time and we're prepared to go through it again.

We want to be a part of the North American Free Trade area and we think that's very positive for us. But in this negotiation as in other negotiations, we will protect our interests and the...I mean I think there are many ways in which Mexico for example can benefit from a Canadian presence not just politically and not just...but in the sense that some of the things that we have like expertise in energy, telecommunications and some of those things are going to be of great interest to Mexico. So we see this as very positive but we've been through this before. I mean trade negotiations are not easy negotiations.
