The Order for Private Bills having been disposed of;

The Bill No. 151, An Act respecting certain appointments in the Post Office Department, was read the second time, considered in Committee of the Whole, reported without amendment, read the third time and passed.

The Bill No. 160, An Act to amend the Criminal Code, was read the second time, considered in Committee of the Whole, reported with amendments, considered as amended, and ordered for a Third Reading at the next sitting of the House.

The House went again into Committee of the Whole, to consider certain proposed Resolutions to amend the Judges act.
