

The said bills were deemed to have been read the first time and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House pursuant to Standing Order 103(2).

A Message was received from the Senate communicating to this House the evidence taken and the papers produced in respect of the above-mentioned divorce bills, with a request that the said evidence and papers be returned to the Senate.

On motion of Mr. McQuillan, seconded by Mr. McIntosh, the First Report of the Standing Committee on Mines, Forests and Waters, presented to the House on Thursday, February 25, 1960, was concurred in, on division.

On motion of Mr. Stanton, seconded by Mr. Crouse, the First Report of the Standing Committee on Agriculture and Colonization, presented to the House on Thursday, February 25, 1960, was concurred in, on division.

On motion of Mr. Pickersgill for Mr. Hellyer, seconded by Mr. Benidickson, it was ordered,—That there be laid before this House a copy of a boundary and a topographic survey of the site purchased, or being purchased from Toronto Industrial Leaseholds (1957) Limited by the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation for its proposed new Toronto Area Office. Item numbered 3, under the heading "Notices of Motions", having been called a second time and not having been proceeded with, was dropped pursuant to Standing Order 48(1).

Item numbered 5, under the heading "Notices of Motions", having been called a second time, was, by unanimous consent, allowed to stand and retain its position on the Order Paper.

Items numbered 7, 8 and 9, under the heading "Notices of Motions", having been severally called for the first time, were allowed to stand.

Mr. Peters, seconded by Mr. Fisher, moved,—That in the opinion of this House, the government should give consideration to the advisability of introducing a comprehensive system of National Health Insurance, more particularly to give consideration to the advisability of: (a) amending the Hospital Insurance and Diagnostic Services Act to provide benefits on behalf of patients in tuberculosis sanatoria and patients confined to mental institutions; (b) introducing legislation to provide medical, dental and optical insurance.
