Question No. 12—**Mr. Skoberg:**

1. For the fiscal years 1968-69 and 1969-70, what specific research studies have been undertaken by the Research Division of the Canadian Transport Commission?

2. Who are the individuals involved in these studies, and when is it anticipated that these studies will be completed?

Mr. Gérard Loiselle (Parliamentary Secretary to Minister of Transport): 1. During the fiscal years 1968/69 and 1969/70, the following studies were undertaken by the Research Division of the Canadian Transport Commission in consultation with other federal government departments, where appropriate.
