CANADIAN FILM DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION

Question No. 188-Mr. Herbert:

- 1. For each fiscal year (a) 1977 (b) 1978, what was the total revenue and net earnings or deficits for the Canadian Film Development Corporation?
- 2. For each year, what was the total (a) of direct or indirect subsidies or other benefits conferred by the government on the corporation (b) of loans, advances or guarantees extended by the government to the corporation (c) investment by the government in the corporation both before and after any write-off?

VETERANS AFFAIRS—TRANSFER TO PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND

- 1. What is the estimated total cost of the move of the Department of Veterans Affairs to Prince Edward Island?
- 2. Does the sum include any amount for additional communications expenditures or for any additional costs resulting from decreased operating efficiency?

Hon. Daniel J. MacDonald (Minister of Veterans Affairs): 1. The total approved funding for the relocation of Veterans Affairs is 23.6 million. This does not include costs for building and land which are under negotiation and may not be borne by the federal government.

2. The Veterans Affairs portfolio does not anticipate a decrease in operating efficiency as a result of its relocation. The amount cited in part 1 does not include any operating expenditures, which will continue to be forecast and accounted for in the normal way.

JACQUES CARTIER AND CHAMPLAIN BRIDGES INCORPORATED
