Dear Dr. Hatcher:-

It is impossible for me and my colleagues of the French Department to give our opinion on your tentative time-table for first year, B.A. and B.Sc, without having seen where you intend placing the other French courses, especially French 2; but I must confess that I do not like the idea of scheduling French 1 every day at the early hour of nine a.m., the more so that it is divided into seven and sometimes eight sections, calling for the attendance of six out of the seven members of my staff. I do not think this is quite fair. I may add that the division of the students into two sections, one at nine and one at eleven o'clock, corresponding to the same division in mathematics has worked admirably, and without any conflict or precluding any options, for about twelve years.
