

The course itself will be a judicious blend of the training in ~~Electric~~ Engineering and in the Honour course of Mathematics and Physics.

Such a training is no new thing; for several distinguished men have already received it at McGill, such as Dr. L.V. King, Dr. R.W. Boyle of the University of Alberta, who did such ~~distinguished~~ <sup>excellent</sup> war work in Applied Physics, and Mr. E.S. Bieler who has just gone to Cambridge with an 1881 Exhibition.

The new course has not yet received sanction from the Corporation of the University, but there is no reason why suitable men should not begin their work at once at the opening of the session, as they will be following approved courses.

It is hoped that a B.Sc. may be granted at the end of the fourth year and an M.Sc. at the end of the fifth year, if a suitable thesis is presented.
