Upon the suggestion of the founder of the Gest Chinese Research Library, the Faculty of Medicine of McGill University, and Board of Governors of the Royal Victoria Hospital, have established for the academic year of 1932-33 a Scholarship for Research in Food Values in Chinese Foods. These and other similar projects in mind for the future offer practically virgin fields for research. Endowment Funds and Fellowships would enable pre-doctoral and doctoral students to come to the Library for projects in various fields of research in the culture and experience of a people whose continuous existence as a social and political unity is the longest and one of the richest of the nations of the modern world. PROCEDURE. In co-operation with other agencies and

PROCEDURE. In co-operation with other agencies and institutions, both in the western world and in China, The Gest Chinese Research Library aims to become a centre for cultural intercourse of the East and the West. In China, Commander Gillis has established the fieldwork of the Library. Through the development of the foundation already well laid at Peiping, exceptional facilities are thereby created for constructive work of great value, not alone for the Library, but for active research scholars. Through the systematic use of the resources of the Library in Peiping and at McGill University, there is an unusual opportunity for Chinese culture, through its literature, to make definite contributions to western culture.
