

sec. (i) the word "published" is substituted for the word "produced," as in the present Act. Should it happen in the future that the United States is included in an Order in Council by Her Majesty, those acquainted with the facts of the case can readily see what a wonderful difference there would be in favor of the United States publisher by the substitution of the word "published" for the more definite word "produced."

If Canadian copyright legislation is to be restricted by Imperial legislation, it is evident that a formal protest from Canada should be entered against certain of the sections of this new Bill.
