## WHEAT MARKET DROPS TO NEW LOW RECORD LEVEL

**Prospects for Early Peace in Balkans and Bearish Domestic Situation Brought Another Decline in Chicago Pit—Corn and Oats Easier.**

CHICAGO, Nov. 14.—Wheat prices broke today under the seasonal low record established 24 hours before. Hope of speedy peace in Europe was chiefly responsible. At the end of the session a feeling of steadiness prevailed, but the market showed a net decline of 3-4 to 7-8 and 10.

Corn finished 1-4 to 1-6 down, oats off 1-8 to 1-4, and provisions varying from 5c lower to an advance of 17 1-2.

Waning of hostilities with Turkey affected wheat thru the stoppage of exports from this side of the Atlantic, and because of speculative sales here by foreigners. As a result discouraged long throw much of their holdings over, and at the same time short sellers put on pressure. Big receipts at primary terminals counted against the bulls, as did reports of curtailed milling operations at Minneapolis. Commission houses absorbed wheat in the decline, and prevented any worse drop, although such buying was in the face of continued favorable weather and crop news from Argentina.

**Low Level in Corn.**  
Latest trading in corn was at the lowest price of the season. Increasing receipts and improved quality had considerable to do with weakening the market and the break in wheat did the rest. Cash grades were slow.

Oats eased off on account of a predicted liberal increase in stocks. Shorts who had been hammering provisions, turned to the buying side. There was an irregular close which averaged about the same as last night.

**CHICAGO GOSSIP.**  
Nell Beatty & Co. say at the close:  
Wheat—It was an extremely bearish market in wheat all day and the close was near the bottom. At the low point the market was 1c or more under last prices yesterday. The decline was almost uninterrupted. It must be conceded that the decline is in line with bearish commercial position of wheat at home and abroad, with the supporting political news from the other side eliminated for the present. It may be well to remember that this market has been declining since that steadily for nearly a week, that scarcely one day has passed today without a friendly feeling for the buying side of the market and it frequently occurs that rather than pressure on the selling side is followed by a natural rebound as the result of conditions. The underlying weakness for the wheat trade is not changed.

Erickson Perkins & Co. (J. G. Besty), wheat at the close:  
Wheat—Up to now the recession in values has been of a character to encourage short sellers. We believe, however, that barring possible adverse news from the Argentine, the time has come when the volume of accumulations will make the price support or no support, from a speculative source.

Corn—The weakness in the general speculative position is accentuated by the fact that every little decline short sellers cover covering rather than pressing such sales. Investment buyers are evidently little attracted at the moment, and therefore, as prices decline the market assumes a really weaker position.
