

MEDICO-PSYCHOLOGICAL ASSOCIATION FORMED

Medical superintendents of the Ontario hospitals, and many others engaged in the study of mental diseases, met Wednesday last and decided to form a Medico-Psychological

Association for the province of Ontario. Dr. E. Ryan, professor of psychiatry in Queen's University, was appointed president, and Dr. J. M. Forster, of the Ontario Hospital, Toronto, secretary. Dr. Robinson, of London, and Dr. Mitchell, of Brockville, were placed on the board. It is intended that this association shall become affiliated with the Medico-

Psychological Association of Great Britain. The object of the association would be to promote the study of psychiatry in Ontario.

Falling Cinder Destroys Garage and Three Cars

A burning coal falling from a small stove in a frame garage in the rear of 1875 Yonge street yesterday afternoon destroyed three automobiles with a loss estimated by the fire department at \$15,000. The coal fell in a

small pool of gasoline, and within a few minutes the two-storey building was a mass of flames. The alarm was given at 2:30 and when firemen from Yorkville and Balmoral avenue halls arrived there was no chance of saving any of the cars. The garage and cars were owned by Elias Rogers. The loss to the cars was placed at \$12,000 and the garage \$3,000.
