poration a franchise it bevelled alder-
men, misled civic officials and secured
control of most of the newspapers and
most of the lawyers. In the United
States the control of the coal areas was
in the hands of a few. They controlled
the railways and charged the public
from \$6 to \$10 a ton, whereas if the
state owned the coal, it would be able
to deliver the commodity to the people
for less than \$2 a ton. Ontario had no
coal, but Providence had given the
greatest source of electrical energy that
any country was possessed of. So long
as we should be independent of the coal
barons of the United States when the
scientists have solved the question of
converting electric power into heat for
our homes.

Needs of Laboring Men.

Speaking of the fight for cheaper
fuel, Mr. Maclean said he had been
able to show that our railways, en-
dowed by the people of Canada, were
carrying traffic originating in New
York and the New England States, and
in Michigan, thru Hamilton, for two
cents a mile, while sitting alongside of
these passengers were Canadians pay-
ing three cents a mile.

"That's what you get for allowing
corporations to get control of the rail-
ways," he said. "An ordinary working
man was more likely to be supported by
the view of these questions than a
corporation lawyer, suggested Mr.
Maclean amid applause, and Mr. Whit-
ney should have the support of men
like Studholme, who believed in the
principle of public ownership. It would
be a good thing to have a labor man
in charge of the railway, and no in-
jury would come to either political
party. If Scott was elected it would
be an indication to the government that
the working men were indifferent to
their own interests."

Mr. Maclean concluded by urging or-
ganization. Strange devices would be

workmen. He appealed to the working
men to be a whole holiday on election day.
