Developments Will Follow.

The significance the immediate bearings of the New York Central-Pennsylvania deal will show in a variety of developments, and one of the earliest is likely to be the acquisition, in the joint interest of a number of smaller subordinate railroads lying between the lines of the two systems and having status in the past as continual challengers of jealousy and disturbance—properties of the Buffalo, Rochester and Pittsburg type. It may even be of official record that the Board of Directors of the Pennsylvania Railroad and the Board of Directors of the New York Central Railroad have by special, formal, detailed-resolution, directed and empowered their respective presidents to meet, confer and act on this line. One of these directors is the authority of The New York Times.
