

Scene Enacted in Legislative Chamber Yesterday at Prorogation Will Be Historic.

THREE NEARLY OF A KIND TOGETHER

Sir Oliver Mowat, Hon. A. S. Hardy, Two Ex-Premiers, and Premier Ross Side by Side.

Pageantry and pathos vied at the Parliaent Buildings yesterday afternoon. His Honor the Lieut.-Governor was present in all the glory of court uniform, but his feebleness was commented on in sympathetic tone by all. At the hour for proroga tion the band of the 48th Highlanders, with the National Anthem, announced the arrival of Sir Oliver. The guard of honor, composed of a hundred Highlanders, under Capt. Brooke, saluted, and the first scene, brightened by sunshine, delighted the concourse of spectators who were assembled the entrance to the Parliament Build-

In the Chamber the scene enacted will be historic. On the Speaker's dais, aged and feeble, the eminent ex-Premier, now resenting His Majesty; at his right among the guests, his immediate successor, ex-Premier Hardy, and standing almost ex-Premier Hardy, and standing almost at His Honor's side, the second in the succession, Premier Ross. Volunteers' Land Grants.

I notice with much satisfaction the recognition so well deserved which is given to the volunteers who served in South Africa, as well as to the volunteer militia of Ontario who served on the frontier in 1866 and 1870. The grant of 160 acres of land to each of the vol-unteers and their families is, I believe, and, at the same time, be regarded by the people of the whole province as a just tribute to the patriotism of the men who risked their lives in the interests of the Empire and the province.

General Legislation.
