20,000 PRISONERS TAKEN BY BRITISH ON ASIAGO PLATEAU

BRITISH TAKE OVER 20,000 PRISONERS AND HUNDREDS OF GUNS ON THE ASIAGO PLATEAU

Haig Opens Attack at Dawn Today on a Wide Front South of the River Scheldt--Italian Successes Result in Thousands of Austrians Falling Into Hands of Gen. Diaz's Troops.

London, Nov. 4.—More than 20,000 prisoners and several hundred guns have been taken by the 48th British division operating on the Asiago Plateau towards the Trentino, it is announced in an official statement issued by the war office today.

BRITISH ATTACK ON WIDE FRONT TO SOUTH OF RIVER SCHELDT

London, Nov. 4.—At dawn this morning British troops south of the Scheldt River attacked on a wide front, according to a report received from Field Marshal Haig today. The report says that the attack has been launched satisfactorily.

The text of the statement reads: "At dawn this morning we attacked on a wide front south of the Scheldt. The attack is reported to have been launched satisfactorily."

SAMMIES TAKE 5,000 HUNS.

Washington, Nov. 4.—The first American army has captured dominating heights from the Germans northwest of Verdun and brought under the fire of its heavy guns the important railroads at Montmidy, Longuey and Conflans. Gen. Pershing so reports in his Sunday evening communique, announcing an advance for the first army of twelve miles on an eight-mile front in three days. Prisoners captured numbered more than 5,000, and guns more than 100.

GERMAN ARTILLERY ACTIVE.

Paris, Nov. 4.—The Germans maintained activity with their artillery and machine guns throughout last night on the entire fifteen-mile front along the Aisne, between Rethel and Semuy, according to today's war office report.

ITALIANS CONTINUE ADVANCE.

Rome, Nov. 4.—The entire Italian front continues to move forward, the war office announced today.

Rome, Nov. 4.—On the mountain front from Tonale to Lake Garda west of Trent, the Italians are progressing rapidly and are advancing on Riva and other points west of the Adige.

U. S. TROOPS NEARING SEDAN.

With the American Army on the Sedan Front, Nov. 4.—American troops pushing northward towards Sedan early last night had reached Sommeville, five miles north of Buzancy and thirteen miles south of Sedan.

The centre of the advancing line is held by troops from New York, Maryland and West Virginia. To the right and left of them regulars and troops from New York, New Jersey and the district of Columbia, Texas, Oklahoma, Kansas, Missouri, Colorado and New Mexico.

ARGONNE CLEARED OF ENEMY.

PARIS, Nov. 4.—The Argonne region has been cleared of the enemy by the French and American forces, the war office announces tonight. Numerous villages and important positions were taken in Sunday's fighting.

EMPEROR KARL INSISTS THAT HE WILL ABDICATE

Basel, Nov. 4.—Emperor Charles of Austria-Hungary is determined to abdicate and will retire to Switzerland, German newspapers say. The emperor made this announcement, it is added, during a conference on Saturday with the new Austrian Government and other influential leaders in the dual monarchy.

HUNGARIANS WILL DECIDE THE FORM OF GOVT. BY VOTE

London, Nov. 4.—The population of Hungary a month hence will take a public vote to decide on the question of a monarchy or a republic, according to an Exchange Telegraph dispatch from Copenhagen today. In the ballot the women will have the same electoral rights as the men.

1,263 DEATHS IN PARIS CAUSED BY INFLUENZA

Paris, Nov. 4.—During the week ending October 30 there were 1,263 deaths caused in Paris by the influenza epidemic. During the previous week 890 deaths were attributed to the malady. Of those who died, 446 were males and 817 females. Nine hundred of those who died were persons between 20 and 50 years old.

HOSTILITIES AGAINST AUSTRIA STOPPED AT 3 O'CLOCK TODAY

Austrian Statement Given Out That Fighting Had Ceased on Saturday Is Characterized as an Enemy Trick.

London, Nov. 4.—An Italian semi-official statement received here today takes issue with the Austrian communique of yesterday afternoon in which it was announced that the Austro-Hungarian army had suspended hostilities following the conclusion of an armistice. The statement is denounced as an enemy trick, and it is declared that hostilities will continue to be pressed until 3 p.m. Monday, the time set by the armistice for their suspension. The semi-official statement says: "The Austrian war communique dated November 3, at 3 p.m., announcing that according to an armistice that had been concluded the Austro-Hungarian army had suspended hostilities in the Italian theatre of the war is false. At 6 o'clock in the evening of November 3 the armistice had not yet been signed by the plenipotentiaries of the Italian and Austro-Hungarian governments, and at any rate, the provisions of the armistice itself do not call for the suspension of hostilities until 3 o'clock on the afternoon of November 4. Meanwhile the Italian army is continuing its operations. On the other hand, he is attempting with false news of the armistice to stop the advance of the Italian columns, and so gain time and save as much as possible of his men and material. Arrangements have been made to counter-attack the last snare of the enemy."

METZ REGION IS ATTACKED BY AIRMEN

Railways and Airplane Hangars Bombed by Independent Force.

London, Nov. 4.—Railways and airplane hangars in the region west of Metz were attacked today by the British independent air force, says an official statement issued this afternoon. The statement says: "Today we carried out heavy attacks on the railways in and around Sarrebourg. One squadron attacked Buhl with good results. Little was obtained on the rear hangars there. All our machines returned."

AUSTRO-HUNGARIAN TERRITORY OPENED FOR ALLIED OPERATIONS AGAINST THE GERMAN EMPIRE

ARMISTICE TERMS SIGNED BY AUSTRIA

Washington, Nov. 4.—The terms of the Austrian armistice, with parenthetical explanations of minor errors in cable transmission, were announced by the State Department today as follows: Following are the terms of the armistice imposed upon Austria, which went into effect at 3 o'clock today:

Military Conditions.

FIRST.—The immediate cessation of hostilities by land, by sea and air.

SECOND.—Total demobilization of the Austro-Hungarian army and immediate withdrawal of all Austro-Hungarian forces operating on the front from the North Sea to Switzerland, within Austro-Hungarian territory, limited as in Clause 3 below. Their ships and army artillery is to be surrendered to the Allies and the United States of America. Delivery of the same, beginning with all such material as exists in the territories to be evacuated by the Austro-Hungarian forces.

THIRD.—Evacuation of all territories invaded by Austria since the beginning of the war, withdrawal within such periods as shall be determined by the commander-in-chief of the Allied forces on each front of the Austro-Hungarian armies behind a line fixed as follows: From Plombières to the north of the Stelvio it will follow the crest of the Rhetian Alps up to the sources of the Adige and the Eisach, passing thence by Mount Reschen and Brenner and the Heights of Oetz and Ziller. The line then turns south crossing Mount Toblach and meeting the present frontier of Carinthia.

It follows this frontier up to Mount Tarvis and after Mount Tarvis the way as to include Cassua, Matulija and Volosca in the evacuated territory. It goes down towards the coast in such a way as to include Trieste, Udine and the Col di Predil, Mt. Mangart, the Tricorno (Terlugo) and the watershed of the Col di Podberdo Podlancan and Idria. From this point the line turns southeast towards the Schneberg, excludes the whole basin of the Save and its tributaries. From Schneberg it goes down towards the coast in such a way as to include Trieste, Udine and the Col di Predil, Mt.
