\$1,110 Raised Including Value
of Labrador Bale.

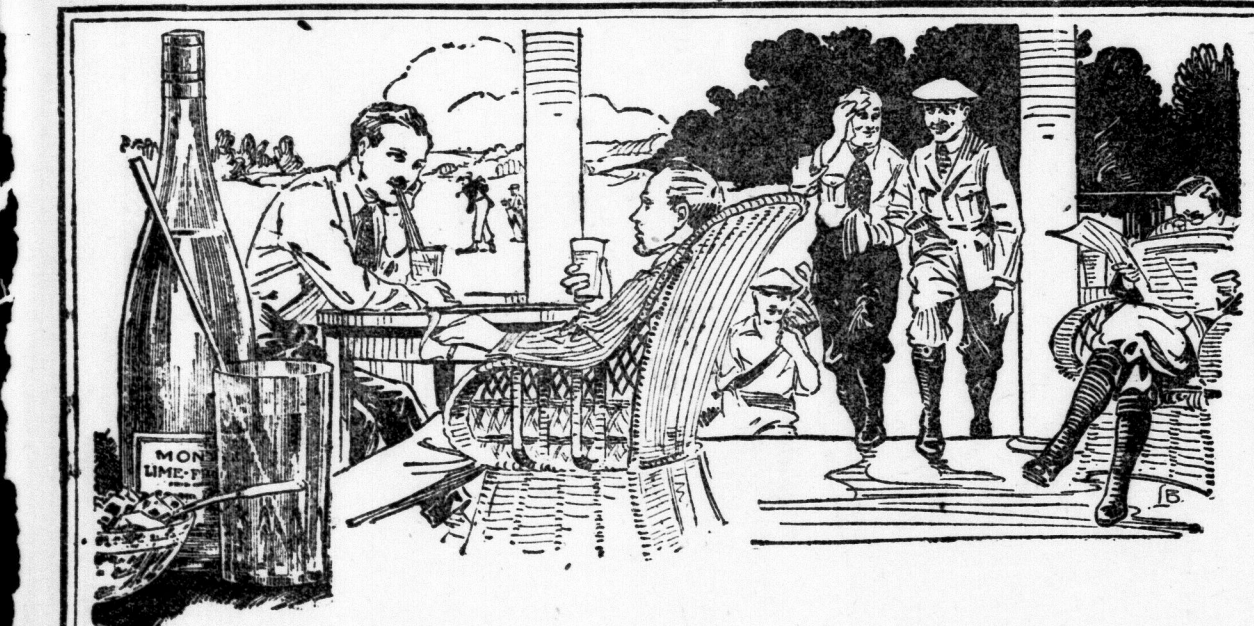
