The report speaks of the frequent presence of Roman Catholics, especially at funeral services, and of the young people who are induced to attend Feller Institute. For people who are so very poor the church makes a good showing financially, \$95.50 being raised for all purposes. They have repaired the Mission House with their own hands, so that what would cost otherwise \$100.00 has cost the Grande Ligne Mission only \$73.85.
