



The licensing of food distributing agencies so that the government may trace any movements of middlemen or the property of the Parish of Lancaster, in the City and County of Saint John, to assess certain persons and companies in the said Parish, lump sums as may be fixed by the Assessors, in place of the pro rata assessment, for patriotic purposes.
