### W. E. STIRLING TO HANDLE MEETING

Large Representation Expected From Affiliated Amateur Clubs in The City.

W. E. Stirling, New Brunswick vice-president of the M. P. B., will preside at the meeting called this evening at 8 o'clock for the Victoria Hotel of all the affiliated amateur clubs in this city to consider plans in connection with the annual meeting of the M. P. B., which has been called by President Millie for Halifax on Friday, October 16. The meeting is expected to voice its protest of the arbitrary manner in which this meeting has been called in the face of considerable opposition from the majority of clubs in the union and also to talk over matters that may arise at the annual meeting. Mr. Stirling has been in touch with most of the local clubs and they have promised to have delegates present.

AMHERST, N. S., Oct. 1.—Members of the Amherst Amateur Athletic Association have expressed their feeling over the action of President Millie of the M. P. B. A. U. of C. in calling the annual meeting of the association in Halifax. It is felt here, as in other quarters, that the season should have been held in Truro, Amherst or Moncton, as the leading clubs outside of Halifax, or at least the clubs sufficiently interested to send delegates to the meetings are situated in Charlottetown, Saint John, Moncton, Amherst, Springhill, Sussex, New Glasgow, Pictou, Westville and Stellarton. In the last few years none of the South Shore clubs have been represented at any of the M. P. B. meetings, while Cape Breton had delegates present last year for the first time. The additional expense required for delegates to go into Halifax will hardly tend to popularize Mr. Millie at a time when personal popularity will be required to hold his post.

### SENATORS STRONG IN RESERVE POWER

Pirates Not so Strongly-Fortified Along The Second Line.

NEW YORK, Oct. 2.—Stanley Harris, manager of the world champion Washington Senators, learned in the world's series a year ago, that there is much truth in the argument that no baseball team is stronger than its reserves. Washington has profited by the lesson, for behind the regular line-up now is a powerful squad of veterans and youngsters, ready to step in whenever a regular fails. Against the Giants, in 1924, Miller and Taylor showed poorly in the infield, and Peckinpaugh was injured, and Blagoe shifted to the shortstop. Infield lapses, almost cost Washington the world's title.

In the coming clashes with Pittsburgh, Harris is well fortified to grapple with injury. Behind Peckinpaugh, whose long service has left him open to trouble with his legs, there stands Everett Scott, who as a member of the Red Sox and Yankees, set up a record for continuous major league play. He is still regarded as a capable performer.

Joe Harris, Nemo Leibold, Bob Veach and Tex Jones, three of them veterans of outfield play, will support the outer defenses where Leibold was alone last season as a capable reservist. Spencer Adams, formerly with Pittsburgh and Boston, are youngsters, trained for infield duty if needed.
