HUSBAND KILLED WIFE.
Thought She Was Burglar and Fired Shotgun.

Detroit, Aug. 19.—Mistaking his wife, Lespa, for a burglar, Howard Swope shot and instantly killed her in the kitchen of their home in River Rouge village. He surrendered to the police, but was released after an examination.

Swope told the police neighbors had warned him of recent burglaries. He borrowed a shotgun and kept it in his bedroom. At 2 a. m. his wife roused him from sleep and told him she heard suspicious sounds. He told her to remain in bed, he said, and started to explore the house. When he reached the kitchen he saw a shadowy figure. Receiving no answer to a challenge, he fired. He rushed to the home of Frank Gulbard, a special policeman. When they returned and switched on the light, Mrs. Swope was lying dead on the floor. She had received the full charge of the gun in the back.

The couple were married soon after the husband returned from the war, in which he served as a sailor. Two children are left motherless.

BABY BURNED TO DEATH.
Child Was Alone When Oil Stove Exploded.

Toronto, Aug. 19.—Allan Jardine, the fourteen-month-old baby boy of Norman Jardine, was burned to death when the house was destroyed by fire at Trout Hill, near here.

Mrs. Jardine lit a fire in the coal oil stove and went out to a neighbor about 100 yards away to get some milk. She left the child asleep in its cot upstairs.

While Mrs. Jardine was away, the stove, it is presumed, exploded, and the kitchen took fire.

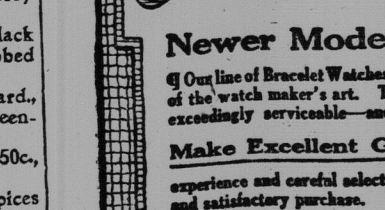
