MARY PICKFORD IN COURT

The second trial of Mrs. Cora C. Wilkenning's suit against Mary Pickford to recover \$108,000 for services in arranging the contract with the Famous Players, by which Miss Pickford was paid \$1,080,000, has been begun in New York before Supreme Court Justice Platzek and a jury.

The plaintiff testified that Miss Pickford in 1915 asked her to be her (Miss Pickford's) adviser and manager. She is alleged to have told the plaintiff that she didn't believe Adolph Zukor of the Famous Players realized her value and said that she was disturbed by a rumor that Charlie Chaplin had a contract for a "fabulous" sum by which he was paid more than she received.
