

Woman of Japan

That the Occidental woman has walked out of the so-called "woman's sphere" is not so surprising. But when Japanese women, whose lives are made up of arranging flowers, brewing tea, and pleasing husbands, have followed suit, the new era for women has come.

Take for example Mme. Yone Suzuki of Kobe, a quiet, gentle Japanese lady, who has made \$100,000,000 since the war began. Her war brides were copper, cotton and sugar.

She is the richest woman in the land of Cherry Blossoms today, and wears a medal and decoration from the emperor for stimulating export trade and commerce.

When her husband died the management of his store fell upon her shoulders, and she didn't know a thing about running a store. The manager, Kanoka, known all over Japan at the present time as her "prime minister," made some unfortunate speculation and instead of chosing the usual way out—suicide—he confessed to Mme. Susuki, who reassured and helped him.

She is still head of the firm of Suzuki & Co., which was one of the first to export Japanese camphor to Europe. It also figured in the Formosan transaction known as the Formosan sugar deal.
