AUSTRIA'S FINANCIAL SITUATION APPALLING

\$1,000,000,000 Required Annually to Meet Interest on Outstanding Notes.
Washington, June 26.—The reports that reach Washington of the economic stress in Austria are associated with the rapidly-increased debt of the empire and the fast-rising volume of outstanding notes.
Exchange has fallen to a discount of 60 per cent. There has never been any success in efforts to sustain the crown, as the removal of practically all the gold to Germany in the early part of the war cut away the basis of credit. At that time the notes outstanding were 2,100,000,000 crowns. By the end of 1918 the amount had reached about 11,000,000,000 crowns, and is now said to be 22,500,000,000 crowns. The ratio of gold to note circulation is, therefore, a fraction of 1 per cent.
The total war debt of Austria-Hungary is estimated at between \$17,000,000,000 and \$18,000,000,000. At the average rate of interest this exacts an annual payment of over \$1,000,000,000.

NEWS OF SOLDIERS

Just three years from the day on which he sailed from St. John with the 26th Battalion, of which he was a member, Private Daniel Emery Oram, was killed in action on the western front. The news was received yesterday in an official despatch from Ottawa by his wife, who survived by a young son, also his mother, Mrs. Mary E. Oram, one brother, John Oram, and two sisters, Mrs. Delahoy and Mrs. James McEachern, all of this city. Before going overseas Private Oram had been employed with the Thompson Manufacturing Company at Grand Bay. Earlier in the war, he had been wounded and was now both in England and recovering from wounds. He was about twenty years of age and had finished in the 140th Battalion, but was transferred to another battalion while on active service.

TRIBUTE TO DR. SHEARER.

(Terminus in Toronto Globe.)
Social service is so prominent in the life and work of the various churches of Canada that the resignation of Rev. Dr. J. G. Shearer of his post of superintendent of the Department of Social Service and Evangelism of the Presbyterian Church, and his acceptance of the wider position of General Secretary of the Social Council of Canada, is an event of real importance. The Social Service Council represents all the churches of the Dominion as well as other organizations which are concerned for social betterment, including temperance and other similar societies. It is thought that the unifying of all these bodies into one great organization on behalf of social welfare will give a force to the work which will tell upon the whole of the Dominion. All who are anxious to see the best social life realized in Canada will wish and pray for every possible blessing on Dr. Shearer in his new and important sphere of service. Social service has undoubtedly come to stay, and the more attention that can be called to it the better, in order that both rich and poor may see that environment counts for a great deal in human life and progress. And yet it must never be forgotten that before the social must come the individual, and that only as individuals are transformed will there be any real and permanent change in social conditions.
