THE PEG-TOP CASCADE.



seam on wrong side of skirt. Now turn right side out and bring single "T" double "oo" perforation keeping upper edges even and back; also bring the two single small "o" perforations together and tack at single large "o" perforation. Close center-back seam. Gather upper edge of skirt between double "TT" perforations. Lap right front edge on left, centers even (double "oo" perforations indicate center-front) and tack invisibly at single small "o" perforations.

The birdseye-mark of the newest skirts in the elevated drape. The French models show that the fullness is centered about the hips to greater extent than ever, leaving the knees quite bare of pleats, puffs, etc.

The first in actual construction is to form the cascade. This is done by bringing the noches at upper end of extension together and stitching with waist.

CAROLINE COE'S TESTED RECIPES

Tapoca Custard To one quart of milk add three-quarters cup of minute tapoca. (If pearl is used, it must soak two hours in cold water then drained before adding to the milk.) Put in double boiler and cook twenty minutes. Beat three eggs with two-thirds cup of sugar, even teaspoon of salt until light and creamy. Stir gradually into the hot mixture. Add one tablespoon of butter and flavoring desired. Turn into well buttered pudding pan and bake twenty-five minutes in slow oven. Serve with cream or foamy sauce.
