HOCKEY

FOOTBALL

New Teams On Harvard's Schedule

The schedule for the Harvard football team of 1915, includes the most radical changes ever made by the Crimson. Five of the nine dates are filled by new teams.

Cornell takes the place of Michigan; Carleton supplants Tufts; University of Virginia displaces Washington and Jefferson; Colby is taken on instead of Bates, and Massachusetts Agricultural College has the date formerly held by Springfield Y. M. C. A. College. The Yale, Princeton, Brown and Pennsylvania State games remain.

All contests, except that with Princeton, which will be played at the Palmer Stadium, are to be held at Cambridge. The schedule follows:

September 26, Colby; October 2, Massachusetts Agricultural College; October 9, Carleton; October 16, University of Virginia; October 23, Cornell; October 30, Pennsylvania State; November 6, Princeton at Princeton; November 13, Princeton at Princeton; November 18, Brown; November 20, Yale.
