Sessions.—During the Academic year of the Normal School, there shall be three sessions for the training of second-class teachers. The first shall begin about the 15th of September; the second shall begin about the 5th of January, and end about the 30th of March; the third shall begin about the 5th of April, and end about the 30th of June.

HIGH SCHOOLS OF ONTARIO.

Each of these schools (which form the Intermediate link between the Public Schools and the Universities), is managed by a Board of Trustees appointed jointly by the county and town councils. In cities the trustees are all appointed by the city council, except where there is only one school in the county. The head master must be a graduate of a British or Colonial University, and obtain a certificate of fitness from the Education Department.

Besides fees, local rates or contributions to the extent of the Government grant must be raised.

An extra grant is provided for masters taking certain meteorological observations, and giving preparatory scientific military instruction. Pupils attending these schools are prepared for matriculation in the Universities.
