## Non. Dr. Tupper's Great Speech

In the House of Commons.

Non. Dr. Tupper, in rising to make the speech, said that he had given notice that as far as possible in the remarks he would make in reference to the very important question before the House, he would pursue the course which the hon. the First Minister marked out for himself in the remarks he made to the House yesterday. He Mr. Mackenzie then stated that he intended to deal with the subject as far as possible apart from considerations of a party or political character. He (Dr. Tupper) might say that it would not be in his power to make that course of his own, but he would confine himself to statements of the facts of the case and the course pursued by the Government, as they presented themselves to his mind and as far as possible without drawing into the question anything that was calculated to turn the consideration of the Pacific Railway from the question of its own merits and that was, as the First Minister said, an occasion expressed himself, that a Canadian Pacific Railway was a matter of the greatest importance to the country, and that it was necessary for the Government to take the most prompt and effective measures to bring it about. He then stated that he had been struck by the fact that the hon. the First Minister had said that the Government were not going to take any steps to bring about the construction of the Pacific Railway until they had first secured the consent of the people of the Dominion. 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
