FIRST EDITION. FIRST EDITION. A MURDER MYSTERY. THE SAWTELLE MURDER.

WILLIAM LAKELED FOUND DEAD IN A YARD. His Body Was Badly Gashed—Almost Nuts and Lying in a Pool of Blood, but in a Rooming House at the Killarney Hotel—A Rooming House Arrested Charge of With the Murder.

LAKELED, Sept. 2.—The lifeless body of William Lakeled was found in the yard of A. H. Butterfield, 13 and 14 Pacific corporation, shortly before 1 o'clock this morning. The body was almost dead. There was a deep cut in the right arm, and another in the right wrist. The head was cut and bruised, and rested in a pool of blood. Three stories above, overlooking the yard, was an open window in the room occupied by James Whitaker, a young Englishman, who was on quite intimate terms with Lakeled.

Two girls who occupy the room adjoining Whitaker's told the officers that they were kept awake by a disturbance in the room of the young man. They heard considerable wrangling, and finally a scuffle. Then they heard a man run into the hall and down stairs. They could distinguish the voices of three men in the room. On being told what the girls said Whitaker still clung to the door, and claimed that he had not been broken by any quarrel in his room. Sergeant Sheehan thought it best to put him under arrest, and he was locked up.

The floor in Whitaker's room was damp in places, but showed no signs of blood. Both Lakeled and Whitaker were employed in the print works of the Pacific mill. Lakeled was about 22 years of age and unmarried. Whitaker is of the same age.
