SECRETARY'S REPORT

ON THE

Examination for the Civil Service of India.

Quebec, 27th December 1892.

In connection with Mr. A. Joly de Lotbiniere's letter I desire to add that shortly after its receipt I called at the Office of the Provincial Secretary and was shewn the Rules governing the Open Competitive Examination above referred to, as, however, they were provided with but one copy which could not be allowed to leave the Department, I communicated with the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission, London, who very kindly sent me twelve copies.
