Sir,
In reply to your letter of the 24th ultimo, relative to the advisability of instructing the Indian Agents to ~~visit~~^{inspect} the different Indian Reserves within their Districts at other times than when they pay the Indians their annuities, and in which you repeat the joint conclusion arrived at by yourself and Mr. Dewdney on the subject, I have to request that you will consult with Mr. Inspector McGill, on his return to Winnipeg, as to the special Reserves which it might be considered advisable for each Agent to visit in the Fall of the year, as recommended by yourself & Mr. Dewdney. It would hardly be necessary for visits to be made to all the Reserves in the different Agencies. For instance, in the Agency of Messrs. Dr. Pherson
