Answers to Some Questions Asked Regarding the Nova Scotia Steel & Coal Company, Limited

Q. How is the new money to be used?
A. To repay a part of the expenditure on capital account for the past year, in the establishment of a new colliery, new open hearth plant, and other improvements and additions to plant and equipment, in order to provide for still larger output.

Q. Is this a regular stock issue or is it secured in any way?
A. This issue is secured by a mortgage to The Eastern Trust Company.

Q. Does it rank after or before the issue of Eastern Coal Company Bonds, which are guaranteed by "Scotia"?

The Result of His Season's Work is Largely a Gamble.

An interesting adventure, when Scotia can hold up their end with any race of people on the face of the earth. They have saved the seven seas in search of riches. They have fitted out and commanded treasure trove expeditions. For a number of years a fleet of Nova Scotia schooners scoured the islands and rocks of the southern seas in quest of the pearl of the fur-bearing seal. And today Nova Scotia is Newfoundland's only rival in the chase for the prolific hair seal.

For the past few weeks the sealing fleet has been fitting out for the cruise to the "sealing grounds." The Scotia Seal is Nova Scotia's representative in the expedition and the Gulf of St. Lawrence is the objective point. The Seal fits out at Halifax and then sails for Channel, Newfoundland, from which place the start is made. For the law says that no vessel shall leave for the ice until a flag has been unfurled from the breeze on Clifton Hill, Channel. Therefore, all the sealing craft assemble there and endeavor to make the most advantageous start possible.
