BISHOP DERRICK COMMENTS ON TEMPERANCE WORK

And Talks of the British Sabbath—Many Reports Deal With at This Morning's Session.

This morning's session of the African Methodist Episcopal Conference opened in St. Philip's church at 11 o'clock.

During the session his lordship referred to temperance work, complimenting Rev. A. A. Grant and his fellow-workers on the admirable and practical manner in which they had dealt with the evil in St. John.

"The world is growing better daily," said his lordship. "Every hospital is a victory for religion and testifies to the spirit of goodness asserting itself for the betterment of mankind."

On Sabbath observance the bishop stated that no nation held the day in reverence as did that governed by the Union Jack.

Reports from Presiding Elder Kerry on education and temperance were presented, but his lordship sent both back to the committees for reconstruction.

Rev. M. Gibbs presented his report for St. Philip's, which was accepted, and complimentary remarks made by the bishop on the splendid showing in his first year's pastorate.

The committee on first and second years studies reported Austin Morgan president and recommended him for ordination as deacon.

The memorial committee's report before being adopted brought forth high tributes from the bishop and members of conference, to the memories of the late I. T. Richardson and A. B. Walker.

Rev. Mr. Pearson presented his committee's report on the state of the church, which was accepted.

The session closed with a prayer and singing of the doxology, to resume at 2.30 this afternoon, when further reports will be dealt with.
