FREDERICTON FIRM AWARDED CONTRACT

Smith Merrithew & Com- pany will put up Build- ings at Experimental Sta- tion—River Dredging.

Ottawa, Aug. 14.—A contract has been awarded to W. J. Poupore Com- pany for dredging to Island River, N. B., to the amount of \$64,800, and to Smith Merrithew & Co. of Frederic- ton, for a horse barn, cattle barns and dairy buildings at the experimental station at Fredericton. The horse barn will cost \$34,000; the cattle barns \$25,800, and the dairy buildings, \$6,000.
