Prices Falling On  
Wholesale Groceries

Little Change During the Week in Country Produce Prices—Eggs Easier.

As far as wholesale groceries were concerned the market this week was a falling one, of fourteen staples affected, an advance was quoted in but two. There was little change in country produce prices, eggs were somewhat easier. The advances and declines in wholesale prices were about balanced. There was no change in any other lines of the list quoted by The Standard.

In wholesale groceries, sugar, both yellow and standard, was down 25 cents on the hundred. Yellow this week was quoted at \$7.45, and standard at \$7.35. Molasses which was quoted at \$7.50 to \$7.60 cents per gallon last week, can be had for 65 cents at present.

Wheat beans are thirty cents less per bag, the present price is from \$5.50 to \$5.60. Pot barley fell off 25 cents a bag, the present price is \$4.25 to \$4.30. Cornmeal in bags is down 20 cents, and granulated cornmeal 15 cents, this week's prices are for the former \$1.90 and for granulated, \$2.

Seeded raisins, in 16 oz. packages at 21 1/2 cents, are down a cent and a half, seedless are quoted at from three to six and a half cents less than previously, present price 21 to 25 per 16 oz. package.

Ontario flour at \$3.10 a barrel, is half a dollar lower, rolled oats at 18 per barrel, thirty cents lower, at \$3.25 per 90 pound bag, fifteen cents lower. Cheese and prunes were the only lines quoted at an advance, cheese advanced a cent a pound to 21-22 cents per pound, prunes advanced from a quarter to a half a cent per pound, this week's price 10 3/4 to 17 1/2.

In wholesale fruits, the introduction of Florida grapefruit caused that line to drop a dollar a case, this week the price is \$6.50 to \$7.

California lemons advanced 25 cents to \$7 per case, oranges from the same State advanced from fifty cents to a dollar and a half, price \$2 to \$3.

There were no changes in the wholesale quotations on hides, oils, fish, feed, or meats.

LAWFORD GRANT.

Lawford Grant, managing director and treasurer of the Eugene F. Phillips Electrical Works, Limited, who have closed an agreement with the Brockville, Ont., Board of Trade to remove its plant and works from Montreal to Brockville. The plant will cost between 2,500,000 and \$3,000,000, and will give employment to some six hundred hands. The town has granted a site of 132 acres, and work on the buildings, including a rolling mill, to occupy fifteen acres of floor space, will start at once.

Canadian Trade  
For October  
Was \$140,774,401

Ottawa, Nov. 17.—(Canadian Press) The grand total of Canadian trade for the month of October, 1921, amounted to \$140,774,401, as compared with \$126,917,037 in October, 1920. Merchandise imported during October this year was valued at \$52,218,248, as against \$106,770,037 for October last year. Duty collected in October, 1921, amounted to \$9,270,498. Duty collected in October, 1920, was \$12,572,440.

Ratify Merger of  
Oil Companies

Union Oil Company and Royal Dutch Combine Their Interests.

New York, Nov. 17.—The stockholders of the Union Oil Company of Delaware today unanimously ratified the plan for merging all of its properties with the Royal Dutch Petroleum Company. The plan involves all of the United States interests of the Royal Dutch Company, excepting its tankers. The merger will enable the two corporations to proceed with the creation of a new company having a capital stock of 10,000,000 shares without par value.
