Ottawa, Nov. 6—The Transcontinental Railway Commission has decided in public interests to operate the completed line of the National Transcontinental Railway in New Brunswick, temporarily, i. e. until such time as the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway Company has applied for and been granted a lease of this section of the line under the terms of the National Transcontinental Railway Act,

Accordingly, commencing Wednesday, Nov. 20, a tri-weekly service will be inaugurated for both freight and passenger service between Moncton and Edmundston,

Recently there has been considerable discussion in the Austrian press concerning the origin of the polka, and it appears that at last the question is settled and the origin of the dance finally determined.

It appears that the polka was the improvision of an Austrian madservant who tired of kitchen work, began to dance at her own sweet will, singing the while a native folk song as accompaniment. He master and mistress caught her in the middle of her dance and made her come into the drawing room, where she danced it again before a musician named Neruda, who transcribed the music and the time. That all happened in 1830.

Five year later, in 1835, the dance was introduced to Prague. Hore it received the name "Polka", on account of its finit step, "Polka" being a Czech word meaning "one-half." Faur years after, in 1839, the polka was introduced to Vienna, where it immediately became the one fashionable dance.
