London, May 31. In Parliament last night relations between this country and America were discussed.

The Lords Granville refused to give a satisfactory reply to questions propounded by several members, while Gladstone in the Commons pronounced a satisfactory reply as soon as the American Congress adjourned.

Granville said the British Government had not abandoned the consideration of the Treaty, and negotiations are still in progress.

The Times intimates that Treaty negotiations are virtually concluded and throw the blame on America.
