

of the corps, shall be entitled to acquire a knowledge of military discipline, and will be allowed to "fall in" with the regularly enrolled men of the Company.

SEC. 2. Some persons may be disposed to become Honorary Members, merely to assist and forward the welfare and efficiency of the corps; in such case they need not, unless so disposed, render any military services whatever.

SEC. 3. Each Honorary Member shall contribute monthly or yearly towards the funds of the Company, the amount to be entirely discretionary with the person subscribing.

SEC. 4. No person can become an Honorary Member without the approval of the Commanding Officer.

The foregoing Rules were adopted at a general Meeting of the Members of this Company, held on Thursday Evening, the 6th day of March, 1862.
