An Act further to provide for defraying the expense of the River Police at Quebec.

TAT HEREAS by the first section of the Act passed in the Preamble. Session held in the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her 14, 15 V. c. 25. Maiestv's Reign, and chaptered twenty-five, it is provided, that the Master or Commander of every Vessel of the burthen of 5 one hundred tons or more, entering at the Port of Quebec, from any Port or place situate beyond the Eastern limits of this Province, or clearing at the said Port of Quebec, for any Port or place situate beyond the Eastern limits of this Province, shall, over and above all other sums payable under any 10 Act or Law now in force or hereafter to be enacted, pay to the Collector of Her Majesty's Customs at the Port of Quebec, a sum equal to three farthings for every ton of the registered measurement of such Vessel; And whereas it hath become necessary to increase the said tonnage duty in order to secure 15 the greater efficiency and usefulness of the said Police Force: Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of Canada, enacts as follows:

- I. The Master or Commander of every such Vessel as aforesaid, The duty unshall pay to the said Collector in addition to the sum of three der the said
 farthings, for every ton of the measurement thereof, the further
 sum of one farthing for every ton of such measurement.
