

broad, exclusive of sap, and not less than one inch thick at the thinnest part, and shall be reckoned at two-thirds of the price of Pipe

**Puncheon Staves;** Staves of corresponding thickness; Puncheon Staves shall be three and a half feet long, and four inches broad, exclusive of sap, and not less than one inch in thickness at the thinnest part, and shall be reckoned at one-half the price of Pipe

**Heading;** Staves of corresponding thickness: Heading shall be two and a half feet long, five inches and a half broad, or upwards, exclusive of sap, not less than one inch thick at the thinnest part, and shall be reckoned at one-half the price of Pipe

**Tierce Staves;** Staves of corresponding thickness; Tierce Staves shall be two feet eight inches long, three and a half inches broad, and not less than three-quarters of an inch thick, and shall be reckoned at one-third the price of Pipe

**West India dressed Puncheon Staves;** Staves of corresponding thickness; West India Dressed Puncheon Staves shall be three and a half feet in length, four inches broad, and three-fourths of an inch thick, and dressed;

**Dressed Heading;** Heading shall be two and a half feet long, five and a half inches broad, and three fourths of an inch thick, and shall be reckoned at the same price as Puncheon Staves;

**West India dressed Hogshead Staves;** West India Dressed Hogshead Staves shall be three and a half feet long, three inches broad, and three-fourths of an inch thick, and shall be reckoned at two-thirds of the price of West India Dressed Puncheon Staves: and whenever there shall be no specific agreement to the contrary, between the buyer and seller, four-fifths at least of the whole number

What shall be understood by "Staves," when there is no more specific agreement.
