

Dixie novices bow out of playoffs in extra time

A breakaway goal after 140 minutes of excitement put a sudden end to Dixie novice reps hopes of a berth in the finals of this year's Ontario Minor Lacrosse Association provincial championships.

Dixie advanced to the final of the B series playdowns at Burlington's Central Arena before bowing to Cornwall in a game where excitement reached nerve-wracking heights.

The two teams battled through three periods of regulation time and a 10-minute overtime session without gaining an upper hand. The score was tied 6-6, forcing an extended sudden death extra time.

With 17 minutes and 38 seconds completed, Cornwall capitalized on a Dixie miscue, scoring a breakaway goal to decide the issue.

Robbie Kenyon got a hat trick (including a shot right through the netting) to pace Dixie's attack. Mark Bull contributed a pair and Nick Petelski a solo goal.

Dixie had a bye in the opening round, then knocked off Erindale 2-1 in a hard-fought game in the semi-finals. Bruce Osborne and Mark Bull scored for Dixie and Jeff Graham replied for the hard-luck Erindale side that gained a berth in the second round with a 4-1 conquest of Windsor.

Clarkson ran into a pair of tough hurdles in its A series and lost consecutive games to Peterborough 11-2 and Oakville 5-4.

Markland tourney

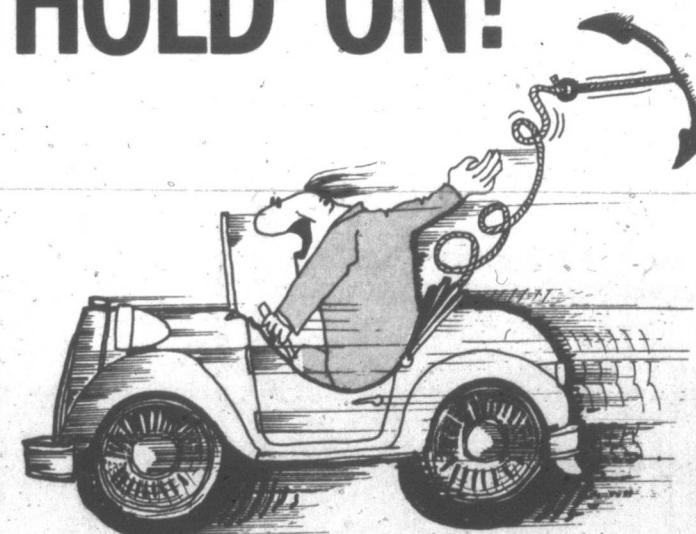
Deadline for entries into the Markland Wood tennis tournament is Saturday, Aug. 26.
