Increwed the Honor of your Letter on the Subject of the three Indians near Stony (reck _ Thase only to remark on that unhappy murder, that every possible Exertion was made in the Year 1816 That a personal Communication with deferent may istrate in the vicinity of Stony helk, Thurste to Mr. Norton himself, begging his parlicular Attention to the Subject of Rordine & after all we compleatly faiter - previous to the last apoined I received a Letter from her Beasley stating that he had procured fresh Soidence - I furnished my Deptition Deputy with all the Documents in my Population and directed him to institute the Prosecution, on his Arrival - lepon bei Meturn part of the Prisoners had made their Iscape & that Mr. h. Da had absorbed & the magistrate who had taken his Information had omitted putting him under Recognizance - thus circumstanced My Dep I was without Testimony to suffer the Prosecution - his to the listpirts being allowed to escape, I have nothing further to say than that if Endunce was furnished of any
