

Replies of Sir John Johnson to the several queries
described in Military Secretary's letter of 12 December
1829 —

1st — When I had the direction of Indian Affairs
the Missionaries also received an Annual Present
of Cloth & other Articles from the Government
Stores, which with Fire Wood & other Necessaries,
furnished by the Indians, added to the Use of the
Parsonage House, appears to me amply sufficient

2^d — The Property now belonging to the Indians of
Sault Ste Louis is sufficient to produce the means of
meeting this demand. —

3^d — The same Answer Applies Equally to this Observation

4th — When I had the direction of Indian Affairs, it was
Customary to issue Cloth & other Articles from the
Government Stores on such Occasions. —

5th — The same Answer as to Observation No. 2 —

6th — The Indians themselves are certainly Capable of
keeping the Roads in Repair or of making new Ones if
necessary. —

7th — They are ^{also} equally able to make or repair these Fences. — 8th
