In reply to your letter of the 12th ultimo, I have to request that you will instruct Mr. Inspector Wadsworth to make a close and careful enquiry into the necessity for hiring white labour for farm B-3, and transporting the same from Shoal Lake, where the farms are situated on an Indian Reserve, and it may naturally be expected that the Indians under direction of the Instructor, should do the work on the farmer's location, as well as on their ^{own} locations.

The object for which farmers were sent being to teach the Indians to work, and not to have it done for them -
