Ottawa, Slet July, 1907.

Sir

I have the honour to acknowledge
the receipt of your letter of 57th instant, and in reply
to your emquiry to inform you that the powers vested in
the council are limited to those for which provision is
made by the act under which the council is constituted,
and the Department fails to rindemything therein referring to such matters as the investigation of alleged
wrong-doing on the part of any master.

81, R. S. C., clearly vests the power of deposing Chiefs and Councillors found guilty of dishenesty, &c., in the Covernor General in Council, and the necessary procedure would appear to be that prescribed by Sec. 95 - namely, report by the Superintendent General after involtigation by his agent.

If. however, you consider it advisable to bring the matter before the council as a preliminary proceeding in your investigation, the Department does not see any objection to your doing go.
